



Class 7 Summer Term



Welcome back after the Easter break.

We hope that you all had an enjoyable holiday! We look forward to a jam packed summer term with lots learning and progress ahead!

Maths

As mathematicians, children will continue to build on learning from the previous two terms. We will continue to count in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s to 100 and beyond. Children will continue recognising place value to 3 digit numbers. They will practise adding and subtracting two/three digit numbers together and will continue to practise reciting number bonds to 20 and applying them to larger numbers. The children will also learn how to solve simple addition and subtraction word problems. The children will continue to look at how to measure length, mass and capacity.

English

This term in English we will continue to focus on: letter formation, handwriting, phonics and sentence construction linked to a variety of text types and topics. Children will be encouraged to extend their sentences through adding in punctuation, adjectives, verbs etc. We will have a focus on using colourful semantics to reinforce sentence structure and increasing independence. Our English topics this term are: sentence types, non-chronological reports and a writing unit based around the Roald Dahl classic 'The Twits'. Children will continue to take part in daily speech and language opportunities alongside their existing sessions, learning through colourful semantics, practising social skills, daily speaking and listening opportunities with the use of Makaton and symbol support.

Religious Education

The children will be learning about special stories for Christians and Muslims.

Science

As scientists the children will find out about different materials and develop their investigative skills. They will learn about the properties of different materials and their suitability for making certain objects. Children will conduct experiments that will test the properties of materials.

Art

As artists children will be learning about the artist 'Vincent Van Gogh' focusing on replicating the sunflowers piece of art work. Children will be using watercolours and learning how to sketch from different perspectives.

Design and Technology

As designers, the children will be designing and making 3D models from recycled materials.

History

As historians the children will be continuing to learn about 'Christopher Columbus' carrying on the topic from the spring term.

Geography

In Geography, children will be comparing and contrasting different locations around the world. We will focus on using correct vocabulary and making comparisons to our own local area.

Music

This term in music, children will be learning about a range of instruments including their voices. They will explore how instruments can be used to express feelings and children will continue to practise keeping to a steady beat/rhythm.

Computing

In computing, children will experiment with aspects of algorithms from the new curriculum through IPAD apps and computer programs and bee bots.
